SPRING GALA TAKES A WALK

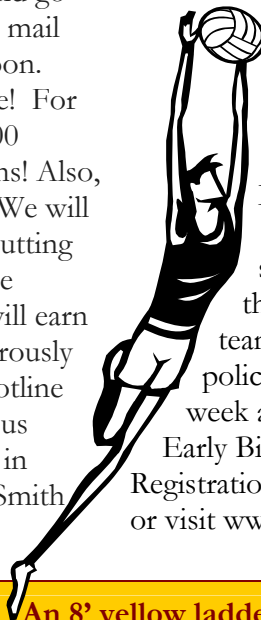

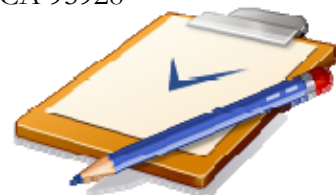

Catholicism Episode 7: "Word Made Flesh, True Bread of Heaven – The Mystery of the Church's Sacrament and Worship." Fr.
